Henri Leconte and Guy Forget were named athletes of the year by the French magazine L'Equipe ("Champion des Champions")

1992: World n°200 Reached the semi-finals of the French Open ("le vengeur masqué")

1993: Won his last trophy in Halle

1996: Henri said goodbye to competition at the French Open
